Gallery Notes–Botticelli for All This Summer!

Sandro Botticelli's exquisite art can be seen all over Fort Worth this August. Botticelli painted frescos in the Sistine Chapel at the Vatican. People are seeing his work in the Uffizi Museum in Florence, Italy. This summer, Botticelli's art is at the Kimbell Museum of Art in Fort Worth.



The Virgin Adoring the Sleeping Christ Child (pictured left) commands attention and reverence as people flock to the *From Botticelli to Braque* exhibit at the Kimbell. As guests enter the exhibit, their heads turn to the left. They can stand respectfully so near the painting that they can count the strawberries in the foreground. For careful observers of the art in the University Christian Church Gallery, it will seem familiar. A small print of one of Botticelli's large paintings entitled *The Adoration of the Magi (pictured right)* hangs in the Gallery at UCC. Mary appears to be wearing the same symbolic coral gown and blue robe in both paintings. The original of the print owned by UCC hangs in the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.

Thank you to all of our adult and youth volunteers who had fun serving as our UCC children learned about God's love in action as part of our *G-Force VBS*. VBS had over 130 children, ages two to twelve participating this year.



We had over 110 children in our building and eighteen fourth and fifth graders in the community learning about service and helping others. Twenty-five percent of the children attending VBS were not members of UCC—our evangelism at work!



All week we focused on service and missions through UCC's connection with Global Ministries and work in Africa. Through the generosity of our VBS families, 479 rolls of toilet paper and over 10,000 sheets of copy paper were donated to The Warm Place, over 75 teddy bears were donated the The Women's Center, and two large storage buckets of individual sunscreens and insect repellants will be donated to the



Day Resource Center. The VBS children also donated over \$680 to be used by our UCC Christmas Angels program in December.

Sometimes the exquisite things we see around University Christian Church exist as by-products of God's grace and positive artistic choices made by good people. Natural shadows are a dynamic art form. People and sun light can cooperate together. Think about the beauty of the shadows at UCC.

Few people who build a church begin by considering the shadows the structure might cast at various times of the day in a year. Yet, the shadows that University Christian Church and gardens cast add delight and spirituality to every sunny day. A significant number of people simply walk on the UCC sidewalks to the TCU campus in the mornings. Their heads are often down, but their eyes can still experience the remarkable opportunity to walk through shadows of tiny crosses cast by the loops in the UCC fencing. People can almost dance or hopscotch through these shadows. The natural shadows of these wrought iron crosses appear to be open crosses. The sunshine beams through the loops.

Could the shadows on the sidewalk provoke thoughts of what is sacred? Could a person be encouraged? Could a person think about walking beyond crosses? Could a person think about seeing life through open crosses? Sunlight and shadows can surprise us as artistic visual blessings inside and outside of galleries.

Back-to-School Month at The Children's Closet

The mission of The Children's Closet, a ministry of University Christian Church, is to spread God's spirit of love, help and hope by providing new school clothing to children in need in the Fort Worth community.

Did you know The Children's Closet is UCC's largest outreach program? We offer new school uniforms, a requirement in public schools, to FWISD students.

Who we reach:

• 82 FWISD elementary schools • 26 FWISD middle schools • SafeHaven Women's Shelter • Women's Center

How many uniforms?

• 7,200 uniforms (at a cost of \$100,000) distributed in 2014-15 school year

How we fund it:

• UCC Outreach budget = \$39,000 • Unsolicited donations including endowments, trusts and gifts over and above pledges

How we distribute:

• Bag-It Night–Wednesday, September 9, starting at 6 p.m., volunteers will fill 2,300 orders for uniforms for thirty-two schools. With 400+ volunteers, we can fill all the orders in slightly more than one hour. This is an intergenerational night with children and adults of all ages working to make sure all children in need have a school uniform for 2015-2016. Don't miss it!

 Back-to-School Month–During the remainder of September, volunteers at the Closet (located in the brick duplex next to the church) will fill orders for over 50 schools (a total of 2,000 uniforms). These orders will be filled on Mondays and Thursdays with new volunteers working from 10 a.m. to noon along with experienced volunteers. Stop by to help!

How can you help?

• Volunteer-Bag-It Night, Back To School month or volunteer to fill orders throughout the year • Donate-Gift the cost of one uniform, two uniforms or an entire classroom!

There are many children in need of uniforms-an estimated 85% of students in FWISD. Despite distribution of around 7,200 uniforms last year, we still reach less than 10% of students. Our goals are to raise awareness and raise funds to support this growing need in our community. We hope these funds will allow us to continue our current level of distribution and reach even more children. Join the Children's Closet in making this September special for our precious school children.

The third year of *Music Makers* Camp was a great success and growing experience for all! The camp was led by me, Mary Farmer, UCC Children's Choir Director, and Elementary Music Teacher, Annie Yandell, and took place directly following VBS. Twenty-one children, aged 7-13, gained musical experience, had fun with friends and created together.



The children created their own musical centered around four biblical stories that were emphasized at VBS; *God Calls Moses, Solomon Builds the Temple, The Healing of Bartimaeus* and *The Three Women at the Tomb.* The children related to and learned from these stories. They displayed creativity as they planned how to present them through music

and acting. They selected characters they would play, composed the music, choreographed the dances and came in each day with new ideas they had been thinking about outside of camp to add to the musical. It was wonderful to see them look forward to creating together! Their smiles and excitement were contagious!



We concluded with a performance of the musical they had worked on all week. It was incredible! The children were confident in what they had done and excited to share it with their families. Annie and I were blown away and so moved by the presentation. After the performance was over and the children had gone, we were already talking about next year and making plans!

I believe if all children could have a positive musical experience like Music Makers we would have many more musicians and music appreciators in our world. Music should never be intimidating to children. It should be exciting, fun and a way to express emotion. Music Makers Camp accomplishes that. They feel comfortable and gain confidence. Most children do not get enough musical experience in school unless they are involved in extracurricular activities such as a children's choir, piano lessons or camps like Music Makers. It's a wonderful way to involve children in music and the arts. Annie and I thank all those who participated this summer and we look forward to offering it again next year!
