O. WESLEY ALLEN, JR.

O. Wesley Allen, Jr. is the Lois Craddock Perkins Professor of Homiletics at Perkins School of Theology Southern Methodist University, in Dallas, Texas.

Dr. Allen has served in a range of academic and ministerial settings. He taught preaching and worship at Lexington Theological Seminary in Kentucky and Drew Theological School, Drew University, in New Jersey for a combined thirteen years. An ordained United Methodist, he has served as pastor of churches in Alabama, Connecticut and Georgia, in campus ministry as Director of the Wesley Foundation at Georgia Tech and the Dean of the Chapel at DePauw University.

Wes received his B.A. with a double major in Religion and Ancient Languages from Birmingham-Southern College, his M.Div. from Yale Divinity School, and his Ph.D. in New Testament (with minors in Preaching and Hebrew Scriptures) from the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences at Emory University. In the arena of New Testament, Allen specializes in the Synoptic Gospels and Acts. In the arena of preaching and worship, Dr. Allen has special interest in rethinking the role of preaching and liturgy week in and week out in community in a shifting, postmodern world.

In addition to article and book reviews, Dr. Allen has published a number of major works in the areas of New Testament studies and homiletics.
