

I hear the train wheels rumblin' and rollin' through the land. Git on board, little children. There's room for many-a more. I hear the bell and whistle, she's comin' round the bend. She's usin' all her power and strainin' every nerve. The fare is cheap and all can go; the rich, the poor are there. No second class aboard this train. no diff'rence in the fare.

You can find today's scripture reading on page 174 of the New Testament in your pew Bible.

The Sermon is a message based on scripture that proclaims God's love and helps to strengthen faith within the gathered community.

The Passing of the Peace is one of the most ancient worship responses. Having received Christ's peace we pass it on.

Faithful giving supports the ministries of our church and helps us develop generosity as a spiritual practice.

Today's offertory is an arrangement of a traditional Spiritual generally accredited to African-Americans who sang about the message of Jesus Christ as well as a way to share their difficult conditions of slavery. This contemporary setting employs vocal sound effects and rhythms to portray a rickety old gospel train that starts and stops as it collects its welcomed passengers.
