This morning's anthem is a movement from one of Franz Josef Haydn's short masses, commonly referred to as the "Little Organ Mass" due to an extensive organ solo in the Benedictus. It was originally composed for the Brothers of Mercy in Eisenstadt, whose patron saint was John of God.

You can find today's scripture reading on page 92 of the New Testament in your pew Bible.

The Sermon is a message based on scripture that proclaims God's love and helps to strengthen faith within the gathered community.

The Passing of the Peace is one of the most ancient worship responses. Having received Christ's peace, we pass it on.

Faithful giving supports the ministries of our church and helps us develop generosity as a spiritual practice.

Doxology is Greek for "words of glory." We use this ancient form of praise to thank God as the offering is brought forward with the bread and cup for the Lord's Supper.
