

The Lord's Prayer is a prayer Jesus taught his disciples and we say it together each week following the Pastoral Prayer. You might begin it by saying "Mother" or "Creator" instead of "Father" depending on how you think about God.

Today's anthem has been widely sung since its publication in 1920. Composer Arthur B.

Jennings (1887-1972) took parts of Isaiah 35 and wrote this dramatic meditation on its vision of the end of sorrow and concluded with a foretaste of the feast to come! Jennings served as organist at the University of Minnesota and Plymouth Congregational Church in Minneapolis for decades.

You can find today's scripture reading on pages 62-63 of the Old Testament in your pew Bible.

The Sermon is a message based on scripture that proclaims God's love and helps to strengthen faith within the gathered community.

The Passing of the Peace is one of the most ancient worship responses. Having received Christ's peace, we pass it on.
