Christmas Eve Worship at UCC



Christmas Eve at UCC will provide opportunities to *Be Still*. Join us for a time to focus on and celebrate the coming of the Christ Child on December 24 at 12, 5, 8 or 11 p.m.

Our noon Christmas Eve service will include a thirty minute prelude of instrumental music, traditional worship, Christmas hymns and communion.

Our Family Worship at 5 p.m. will also begin with a thirty minute prelude of instrumental music. Our children's choirs will sing and the Whitechapel Handbell Choir will play. The Christmas story will be retold through scripture, traditional hymns and live nativity with animals and our own UCC children and youth serving as the angels and shepherds in the amazing story of Christ's birth. The beauty of Christ's light will be shared as children are presented with a special gift of light to take into the world as they leave.

Those attending our 8 p.m. Christmas Eve service will experience a seasonal prelude with harp music and special liturgical dance beginning at 7:30 p.m. This traditional worship service will include Christmas hymns, communion and candlelight. Our Chancel Choir Chamber Choir will provide music and the UCC Ringers will play.

The 11 p.m. Candlelight Worship service will begin with a 10:30 p.m. prelude incorporating harp and liturgical dance. The Chancel Choir will sing and the Ad Deum Handbells will ring. The service will focus on our Advent theme of *Be Still* with traditional worship, Christmas hymns and candlelight.







The Children's Closet, a ministry of University Christian Church, provides new uniforms, clothing and school supplies to disadvantaged children in Fort Worth.

Global Ministries, in mission in more than 90 countries and in covenant with more than 160 partner churches and ecumenical bodies around the world, is the joint global mission outreach effort of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ.

Heifer International provides families with income-producing plants and animals and training on how to care for them. Heifer International educates partners in community building and sustainable agriculture, providing daily nutrition and additional income for basic needs and education of children.

This year, we offer two Advent devotionals available in The Arches: Henri Nouwen's, Unto Us a Child is Born, and Partners in


Prayer, by The Young Clergy Women Project, an ecumenical organization supporting female clergy under the age of forty.




All are invited to pick one up and take time to daily draw near to God and experience the wonder of the season.


