

As the definitions above indicate, the word spiritual encompasses a variety of meanings. During this season of Lent, we will journey together to connect with and lean-in-to spirituality.

We will explore Joyce Rupp's poem Leaning on God (printed to the left), which suggests our physical needs and limitations mirror our spiritual dependence on God's strength.

Each Sunday, the Chancel Choir will sing various African-American spirituals and gospel songs. Created by a community of people in bondage, these spirituals are considered to be the first "signature" music of a new nation. By nature, this music insists on spontaneity and freedom. Allow the Holy Spirit to move us as She will. As the choir slides between notes, and sings swinging rhythms, perhaps we will be inclined to sway our bodies or add an "Amen!" or "Hallelujah!" during the anthem. Fear not!

There will be multiple ways to *LEAN INTO LENT* throughout this holy time of year. Special worship services, studies, and service opportunities will prepare our spirits for the journey, as we make our way toward the cross, and beyond.

Lenten Worship Services

This year as we *LEAN INTO LENT*, we will focus on the Spiritual in its many forms. Included will be some very special services of worship.

March 1 is **Ash Wednesday**. We will gather at 6:30pm in Walker Hall for reflection as we begin the Lenten Season. After worship there will be time for quiet meditation and a chance for everyone to walk the Labyrinth.

We will have two opportunities to worship during Holy Week. April 13 is **Maundy Thursday**. Our time of worship will begin with Foot-Washing in the Gallery from 6:30–6:45pm and a service of Scripture and Song at 7:00pm in the Sanctuary. We will partake in the Lord's Supper and remember Jesus' arrest and betrayal.

On **Good Friday**, April 14, we will gather in the Sanctuary at noon to commemorate the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus. This brief service will be followed by a Friday Fellowship Meal in Room 207.

During this Lenten season, may we open ourselves to the Spiritual, place ourselves in God's care, and follow Christ in pursuing compassion, justice, and peace.

Worship Music Throughout Lent by Dr. Todd Prickett, Director of Music

The Chancel Choir will be singing various African-American spirituals and gospel songs each Sunday during this Lenten season. While some of the tunes will be familiar to you, others may be new. It is our hope that you will embrace the music as a personal reflection of your own beliefs as the message of each song is conveyed. Perhaps some historical perspective will enhance your understanding of this unique American art form and enrich your worship experience.

The Atlantic slave trade brought hundreds of thousands of Africans to the United States with their own strong tribal music traditions. These enslaved African-Americans often sang spiritual songs, an outgrowth of their African culture, as deep expressions of faith amidst terrible circumstances. There are hundreds of these extant Southern sacred folk songs, now known as spirituals. Because their original composers are unknown, they have assumed a position

the whole community. Created by a community of people in bondage, these spirituals are considered to be the first "signature" music of a new nation.

Churches of the urban North in the 1920s, musical elements of the spirituals and the blues fused to give birth to a new musical genre, gospel music. The definition of gospel music varies based upon culture and social context; however, gospel music is characterized by a predominant vocal line, strong harmony, syncopated rhythm, and a refrain. Gospel has continued to gain popularity and has become a predominant contemporary musical form. Although the gospel tradition

descended directly from spirituals, the spirituals have also continued to exist as a parallel cultural force.

Spirituals demand a certain amount of spontaneity and freedom in performance. As the Chancel Choir sings these anthems, you may witness bodies swaying and feet tapping. The music also includes certain variations from the standard American singing tradition. The choir will be singing glissandos (sliding between notes), swinging rhythms, wailing and exclaiming! Maybe you will be moved to add an "Amen!" "Hallelujah!" or "Yes, Lord!" during the anthem.

Your senior minister search committee has been working hard. We have put together a strategy to purposefully find the right minister to lead our church and take us forward into the next chapter.

Our process is based on best practices in executive search, recruiting, and interviewing. Prior to opening the call for papers and speaking to candidates, our first step is to gather and analyze information on UCC's purpose and values. We will work hand in hand with the Board of Stewards, the UCC Marketing Director, and an outside church consultant to ensure this step is completed.

Based on the values and objectives discovered in our first step, the next step is to create interview and screening questions. From here, we start to screen resumes and speak with candidates.

If you have a candidate to refer, please contact them to verify he/she is interested. Each candidate must register with the domination and request their papers be forwarded to the church to be considered

for the position. We'll announce when we are ready for referrals.

Screen and interview candidates

by phone and video call

The screening process takes a month or two to complete. We will review every interested applicant and every referral. However, we cannot give feedback on referrals due to confidentiality concerns.

The final two or three ministers will receive a visit from the committee. The visit will allow us to observe and assess the relationship he/she has with their current church and presence in the pulpit.

Finally, the candidate will be invited to come to Fort Worth with his/her family. Should the visit go well, we will extend a call, or job offer. Assuming the call is accepted, our hope is to have a new minister named and installed by the beginning of Advent.

During the search process, there are three ways to help the committee. First, we ask you pray for the committee, the church, and our new minister. Prayers of wisdom, discernment, harmony, unity, cooperation, and understanding are appreciated. Please

keep our new minister in your prayers as he/she considers this opportunity.

Second, we ask the congregation respect the need for confidentiality. Once the committee starts reviewing names and papers, we are not at liberty to discuss or release information. This protects a candidate's privacy.

Third, we ask you actively participate in providing feedback and information.

A survey will be sent out to the entire congregation to gather information we need to select the right person for this important role. By taking or not taking the survey you are directly impacting the search. Please take the time to give use feedback.

Ways for Children to LEAN INTO LENT



Make A Prayer Chain to Help Guide A Designated Prayer Time During Lent.

At the beginning of Lent, together, with your children, make a list of 40 people, needs or hopes your family recognizes as important. Place each name, need or hope on an individual piece of paper. Link the

strips of paper together into a chain and place in a prominent place in your home. Designate a time each day that you will take one prayer from the chain and say a prayer together as a family.

Guide Your Child in Their Lenten Devotion

Every family with a 2 year old to 5th grader will receive a daily Lenten Devotion booklet, 40 Days & Nights. Please use these devotions with the accompanying daily mobile to guide your children as they LEAN INTO LENT. Additional copies of the childrens' devotions will be available in The Arches.



Family Lenten Recipe | Easter Resurrection Rolls



Prep time: 5 mins Cook time: 10 mins Total time: 15 mins Serves: 8 rolls

Ingredients

1 can Pillsbury Crescent Dough 8 large marshmallows water cinnamon & sugar combined in a bowl

Easter Resurrection Rolls are a simple, fun and meaningful activity to do with children of any age. As you prepare the rolls, think through the Easter story and prepare yourself and your children for the big surprise (hint, hint, something is no longer there when you break open the roll).

Instructions

Preheat oven to 375°F. Spray a cookie sheet with cooking spray or line with parchment paper.

Unroll crescent dough and separate each triangle.

Have children dip marshmallow in water and roll in cinnamon and sugar mixture.

Place marshmallow in the top of the crescent roll and roll into a crescent roll shape, then secure the sides by tucking them under and pinching

them closed. (Don't worry about how they look! They will be yummy!)

Place on prepared cookie sheet and repeat with remaining 7 rolls.

Bake in preheated oven for 8-10 minutes or until golden brown on the outside.

Let cool for a few minutes and then let the children pick a roll to open up. The marshmallow has disappeared! Enjoy.

The Former Library by Mike Morton

When was the last time you were in "the library"? In the works for a couple of years, Building & Grounds has just overseen the transition of this space into a new multipurpose room. The bookshelves and traditional chandeliers have been replaced by a new media cabinet with audio/video facilities, new flooring and paint to match our building standards, and updated light fixtures.

The finish details of the space, for example the trim moulding and media cabinet style, were maintained to preserve the integrity of the original design. New chairs and tables provide flexible



functionality—a reception area for services in the Chapel of the Good Shepard one day; space for a meeting with A/V needs the next.

During this work, both bathrooms were completely remodeled with

new paint, flooring, plumbing fixtures, lighting, and wider door and partition openings to make them handicapcompliant. The hallways in that area also received new flooring, paint and light fixtures. New beams were added in the hallway adjacent to the Chapel to match those in the narthex. Wood doors in that area were re-stained. The kitchen was updated and will now function as a "catering kitchen". New light fixtures in this area all have LED light sources. And the project was completed over 35% below budget!!

So next time, break that routine and visit the space "formerly known as the Library". We think you'll like what you see—and maybe have an idea of what to call this space!
