




Organizational Structure




Church Governance Org Chart

Programs



Weekday School

A group of dedicated educators, ministers and church members opened UCC Weekday School for the first time on September 11, 1967. The school began with two classes of 15 children and quickly grew to 36 enrolled children by the late 60s.

Today, UCC Weekday School is located in two wings of the church—a significant addition to the structure of the church in 2001 included an expansion of the school that allowed a maximum enrollment of up to 362 students. The current staff, which includes one director, four staff members and forty teachers, work with students in Cribs (eight weeks) through a half-day licensed Kindergarten (five year olds).

Our educational philosophy is to help young children become lifelong, enthusiastic learners. These principles are based on that of the premium preschool programs in the nation and guided by the NAEYC, the National Association for the Education of Young Children. Supporting the developmental stages of children ages O-5 years, we provide activities in all major areas of learning (language, literacy, math, social studies, physical development, art, music, and personal/social skills).











Boar's Head & Yule Log Festival

This celebration of the victory of good over evil is perhaps the oldest continuing festival of the Christmas season. It began as a holiday tradition in the grand manor houses of England, and was brought to America during colonial days. There's never a dull moment in this beautiful and entertaining presentation, which is loaded with surprise entrances and exits by the performers.

University Christian Church members and audiences from locally and beyond have been entertained by the Boar's Head & Yule Log Festival annually for the past 42 years. We have marveled at this story of Jesus' birth from its detailed period costumes, the diverse cast that inspires awe and humor without speech, and the glorious mix of music provided by handbells, organ and orchestra.

Performances are historically held on Saturday and Sunday during the first weekend of January at 3:00pm and 5:00pm. These performances draws patrons from near and far! Every seat is filled, so it is suggested that patrons arrive at least one hour in advance.













Room In The Inn

Room in the Inn is a ministry UCC shares in with other local faith communities that takes place every Wednesday evening through Thursday morning for three months during the winter and three months during the summer.

After screening at DRC, guests are picked up by their host church then share an evening meal and fellowship before the guests settle in for a restful night's sleep. Breakfast is served in the morning and guests are taken back to DRC with a sack lunch for the next day.

UCC members, who have completed the required training to participate in this ministry, drive the men to and from the DRC, spend time playing games with them or just visiting, and host the dinner and breakfast tables. Two volunteers remain overnight, while others participate by setting up, working in the kitchen, bringing food, donating lunch ingredients, cleaning up and doing laundry.

Children's Closet

The mission of the Children's Closet

To reach out to disadvantaged children in our community with God's spirit of love, help and hope by providing clothing to children in the Fort Worth Independent School District.

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me. --Matthew 25:35-36

Generously supported by the church, monetary donations to The Children's Closet help buy uniforms, now a FWISD requirement, and also play clothes, shoes, and other necessary clothing items. This outreach ministry responds year-round to requests from school counselors to help children in emergency situations or those whose families cannot afford to buy clothes.

Back to School Bag-it Night

In response to specific requests by FWISD counselors, identified children receive new school uniforms each September and as needed throughout the year. On Bag-It Night, UCC gathers to fill each child's bag of clothes. The counselors pick up their request, along with a gift basket of needed classroom items they often have to purchase with their own money. Each year, approximately 2,200 uniforms are distributed to thirty-two different schools.




Sara Miles and John Shelby Spong. Next year's preacher is North Carolina Disciples of Christ pastor and social activist William Barber II.




