







# **Words from our Senior Minister**


Our young people are growing up in a different world from the one you and I and our parents grew up in. Each year the staff at Beloit College in Wisconsin puts together a list of interesting characteristics to try to give the faculty a sense of the mindset of that's year's freshmen class. Most of this year's class, the Class of 2022, were born in the year 2000.

don't have any children," or "I've already served my time, it's someone else's turn." The fact is, we have all been called to help raise and guide these children as part of our faith family. This calling comes to life in a variety of ways. It might mean serving as a Journey Land Sunday School teacher for a three week commitment or a shepherd for a school year. It could be providing a meal for children's choir or dinner for Sunday evening snack supper. It can be as simple as introducing yourself to a child and tell them your glad they are here.

As we begin a new school year, we encourage you to get to know a child by name by listening, learning and sharing with them on a consistent basis on Sundays.

Our hope is that every single child who steps through our doors will know they are supported, surrounded, and loved by a community of faith that loves them as the amazing people God created them to be.
