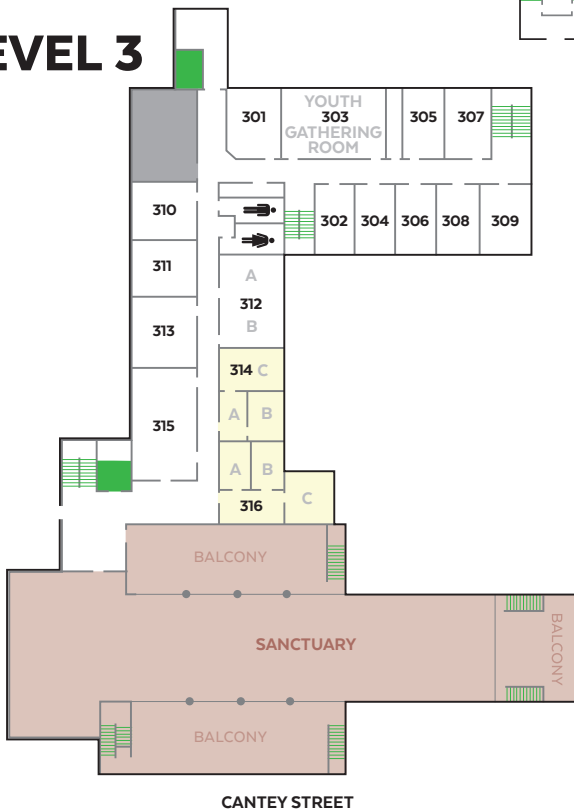

Words from our Senior Minister

Words Matter

I've been struck recently by just how important words are.

For the last couple of months, a very talented group of folks have been working hard on creating a new Vision Statement, Mission Statement, and articulating our Core Values here at UCC. This has been really great, exciting work—at the same time, it has been really hard. It is difficult to find just the right words to clearly and concisely express who we are and who God is calling us to be. Words matter.

Not only that, but we recently partnered with Brite Divinity School and the Church Music Institute to put on a seminar entitled *Expansive Language: Theological and Musical Implications on Church Music*. There was a panel discussion led by the Rev. Dr. Mary Louise Bringle, Professor of Religious Studies at Brevard College. Once again, we talked about the power of words and the importance of language, especially when discussing theology!

Dr. Bringle was able to clearly articulate the difference between inclusive language and expansive language. Inclusive language is used to discuss people. For instance, using humankind instead of mankind. But when we discuss the Divine, it is important to use expansive language. God, certainly, is bigger than we can comprehend, let alone find words to discuss. Language is limited, while the wideness of God is not.

As a community of faith with 'open minds and loving hearts', it is important for us to find ways to talk about God in ways that go beyond the traditional Father, He, etc. This is not new for us. For some time now, this congregation has printed in the margins of our worship bulletin that any gender-specific language is meant to apply to all genders, and all references to God are intended to encompass the full character and nature of God. In the Gloria Patri, for instance, we encourage you to sing "Mother" or "Creator" instead of "Father", depending on how you think about God. And we've felt good about that. It has helped us to think about God in new ways and discover new ways to talk about God.

But I wonder if we can go further. As Dr. Bringle helped us see, people who wish to use expansive language continually have to translate what is before them. They are, quite literally, marginalized.

Following staff discussions and having presented it to both the Worship Life Committee and the Assembly, beginning in Lent we will be using more expansive language in our prayers and responses.

For instance, we'll print "Creator" instead of "Father" in the Doxology. Please know that you are still invited to say or sing and translate to fit your own theology. But what we put forth in print to the public will be expansive.

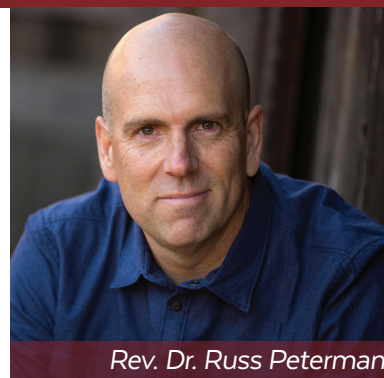
I'm well aware that there are many beloved hymns and anthems that use male language. We won't be throwing those out completely, but rather we will continue to strive to bring a balance with feminine or gender-neutral descriptions of God in other parts of our worship.

Please know that if you have prayed to "Father" your whole life, you aren't wrong. We are simply inviting you to consider new, expansive ways to think about and address God.

Words matter, and how we talk about God shapes how we envision and relate to God as well. I'm excited about widening our understanding of who God is and who God is calling us to be.
